Adam Hales has faced many challenges in his life, he has met them all head on and full speed ahead. From early in his childhood he has faced physical trials that would have stopped most people in their tracks. He had one leg that didn't grow as fast as the other and faced multiple procedures to try to correct that. He also had problems with his foot not growing properly and was very painful to walk or to wear shoes even when his parents bought larger shoes for that foot. When all of the corrective surgeries had failed to make it tolerable to walk, Adam made the decision to have part of the leg and foot amputated. Again he met this challenge head on and never looked back, he worked hard to get used to the new prosthetic leg. He then began to enter, compete, and win winter sports competitions for the disabled.

This amazing young man has once again proven what a remarkable attitude to overcome obstacles can do. Adam and several friends went 4-wheeling near the mouth of Weber Canyon. As they were leaving, one friend driving alone got one wheel of his jeep off the bank of the river. The jeep then overturned trapping his friend upside down under water. Adam didn't hesitate and jumped into the water to help. He couldn't free the seatbelt and called for a knife to cut his friend free. The friend he saved that night was an airman at Hill Air Force Base. The Base has awarded Adam the "Command Award for Valor", the highest possible honor for a civilian.

I want to also honor Adam with the "Outstanding Riverdale Citizen" Award, and thank Adam for his courage in his friends moment of need and in the way he has faced all of the many difficult challenges of his life. Adam "Lead On"!

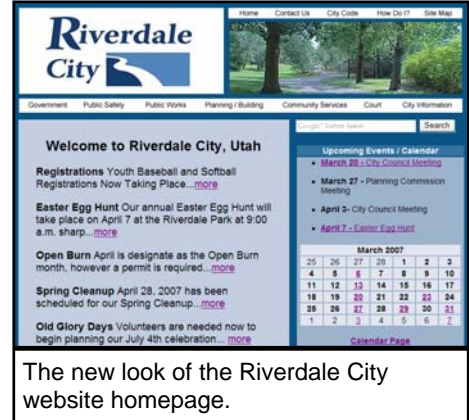

SPRING CLEANUP SCHEDULED

Our Spring Cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, April 28th. As with previous cleanups, roll off dumpsters will be placed at locations around the city. During the scheduled times, residents may bring refuse items and deposit them in the dumpsters. Date and locations of the dumpsters are as follows:

Locations and Times:

- Riverdale Park 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.
- Golden Spike Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- 525 West 4800 South 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

At each location there will be two roll off dumpsters: one for green waste (tree trimmings, grass, weeds, etc.) and one for other items.

Please follow these steps when bringing refuse to unload:

- Please bring enough help to unload quickly.
- Be advised that the attendant will not be able to help you unload.
- Tree limbs must be cut into 6 foot or less lengths and tied into bundles - no exceptions please.
- Children must remain in vehicles for safety reasons.
- Items that will not be accepted include: batteries, tires, paint, chemicals, pesticides, drums, dirt, rocks, concrete, and hazardous waste.
- Hazardous waste can be taken to the County landfill on the 3rd Saturday of each month from April to September. Call 399-8358 for details.

NEW DEVELOPMENT

Recently the old city office building was torn down (pictured) to make way for a new development on the corner of 700 W. and Riverdale Rd. The building was built in 1959 and has served as the Civic Center, Police Station, and Fire Station. The new development taking place will include retail space, restaurants, and new patio homes along 4400 S. where the two vacant houses were torn down.



BE SAFE AND SECURE

OPEN BURN SEASON

The Weber County Fire Marshal has designated the month of April as 'Open Burn Season' allowing citizens to burn leaves, small branches, grass clippings, and other vegetation. This is the only time of the year that open burning is allowed for non-agriculture residents. Homeowners wishing to burn must receive a burn permit from the Riverdale Fire Department and abide by the following:

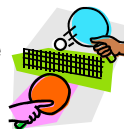


1. Inspection by the fire department before the burn.
2. Permits are only good for the day issued.
3. A water source must be available at each fire.
4. All fires must be monitored at all times.
5. All fires must be out by dusk.
6. If a fire gets out of control call 911 for assistance.

Farmers with more than 5 acres of land in the green belt can burn any time of the year with a permit from the Fire Department. 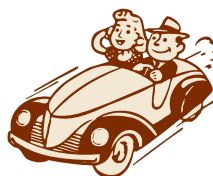
