AMNESTY PROGRAM OFFERED



The Riverdale City Justice Court is offering an amnesty program during the month of August 2007, for those who have outstanding warrants with the court. This is an opportunity for those who have had warrants issued against them to voluntarily come into court and clear up warrants without the fear of going to jail on the warrant. There are two ways that citizens can take advantage of the amnesty program:

1. Those who come into court voluntarily and pay off their fines in full will have the warrant fees deleted from their fines and the warrants will be released.
2. Those who come into court voluntarily and make payment arrangements for their fines will have their warrants pulled, and will not be arrested and taken to jail on the Riverdale warrant. The warrant fees will not be deleted from their fines.

Defendants arrested or contacted by the constable or police department regarding warrants are not eligible for the amnesty program. For a list of those on the outstanding warrant list visit www.riverdalecity.com. Questions may be directed to the Riverdale Court at 394-9314.

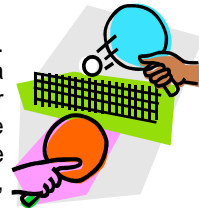


TABLE TENNIS TOURNAMENT

Begins September 6th at 10:00 a.m.

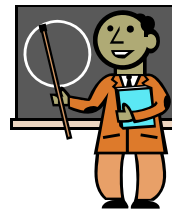
