Loss of a great Public Servant

Rod George passed away on Tuesday July 14th following a car accident. We at Riverdale City are deeply saddened at the loss and send our sincere sympathy to his wife Connie and the rest of the George family.

Rod spent twenty years as a police officer with the Riverdale Police Department. He began his career in Riverdale on July 16, 1978 and retired 20 years to the day on July 16, 1998, working in patrol and eventually became a detective and was later promoted as a sergeant. He was involved in many high profile arrests, and numerous pursuits, including a pursuit where he and other officers were shooting while chasing the offenders.

Following his retirement with Riverdale PD, he joined the Weber County Sheriff's Office. Rod then began working for Adult Probation and Parole in March 2001, as an agent in the Ogden Office of Region II. During his career with the Department of Corrections, he was a field agent from 2001 to 2007. In 2007, he transferred to the Intake Unit. The Intake Unit was a great fit for Rod; he possessed a talent for writing Pre-Sentence Investigation reports.

Rod was also a veteran of the United States Army. He served our country honorably in the Vietnam War as a gunner on a helicopter gun ship. Rod was a caring friend, a loving husband, father and grandfather. Again we express that our hearts go out to his wife, Connie and his family. He will be dearly missed.

Bonnie Jones

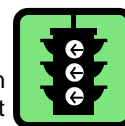
Bonnie has worked as our Animal Control Officer for the past 12 years. For the past 5 years she has also taken on the role of Code Enforcement Officer.

PROTECTED LEFT HAND TURN SIGNALS



Did you know that it is against the law to enter into an intersection on a red light even if you are attempting to turn left? When you are at 700 West attempting to turn left, and the green arrow turns red, you may not make a left turn if you were not in the intersection prior to the green arrow turning red. We have noticed this happening more and more and will be issuing citations for this type of violation. This law applies to all protected left hand turn signals. Your compliance with this law will be greatly appreciated.

PREVENT DAMAGE TO SIDEWALKS



Residents need to be advised that if the roots of a tree planted on their property damages the sidewalk, they are responsible for its repair or replacement. Recently, the city sent out a number of notices to residents informing them of the need to repair or replace sidewalks damaged by the roots of trees on their property. This is an expensive problem that is better to be prevented then corrected. Please be aware of any trees on your property that show signs of causing sidewalk damage.
