Riverdale Road Widening Project

I want to thank UDOT for their cooperation and help to resolve some difficult situations during the construction and to get the project completed ahead of schedule. We appreciate the excellent work of UDOT and Granite Construction so far and look forward to the full completion of the project from Washington Blvd. to Roy. I will continue to work with Roy, UDOT, Rep. Brad Dee, and the legislature to identify funding for the completion of the west portion of the project.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE

Due to very dry conditions, fire restrictions have been enacted on the east side of Riverdale City. No open fires such as outdoor fire pits, recreational cooking on an open fire, and fireworks, including legal fireworks, will be allowed on the east side of the city. The boundary line runs from the east side of Parker Drive on the north end of the city heading south along Rivervalley Drive to 700 West, continuing to River Park Drive, then following 1050 West to the south end of the city. Cindee Colby works as our accounting clerk at the city offices. She has been with the city for 2 years. What Cindee enjoys most about her job is the people she works with.



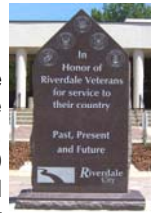

"Did you know?"

- ⇒ **City Property tax:** In 2009 the city rate was .001313. The new 2010 city tax rate is .001278 down 2.7%.
- ⇒ **County Assessed Value:** If your county assessed value is the same or lower than last year's then your city taxes will be lower than last year's.
- ⇒ **City Budget:** Property taxes have comprised less than 8% of the city budget historically, sales taxes will remain the key to our financial survival at the current level of services.
- ⇒ **Chip and Seal:** Although a nuisance at the time, doing chip and seal protects the asphalt road and will extend the roads life for up to ten years, which in turn saves the city a lot of money in the long run.
