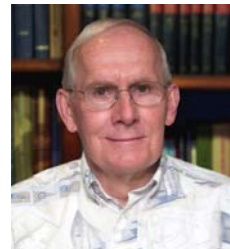
MUNICIPAL ELECTION RESULTS

CITY HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

All city buildings will be closed for Christmas Day on Friday, December 25th and for New Year's Day on Friday, January 1st.



There will be no change in our garbage pickup schedule for these holidays. Please put out your garbage cans for Wednesday pick up as you normally would.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP

The Christmas tree pickup has been scheduled for Wednesday, January 6, 2010. Trees must be placed by the sidewalk in an easily accessible area by 7:00 a.m. The tree stand must be removed and trees longer than 8' must be cut in half. Please ensure that the tree is not covered by snow. Crews will only make one pass through the city.

SEWER RATE INCREASE

Our city officials and administration strive to keep rates and fees as low as possible for city residents. However, two circumstances have made it necessary to enact a rate increase for the sewer portion of the water utility bill.

First, although Riverdale City operates and maintains our own sewer collection system, the processing of sewage is done at the wastewater treatment plant operated by the Central Weber Sewer Improvement District. The majority of the sewer fee included in your city utility bill is for the operation of the treatment plant which is charged to the city by the District. The treatment plant is currently undergoing a \$140 million upgrade and expansion. To finance the project, the District has increased the rates it charges to the city.

Second, the deterioration of some city sewer lines have necessitated their replacement. Lines were recently replaced as part of the Riverdale Road widening project. Other line replacement and repair projects are scheduled for the near future.

The implementation of the sewer rate increase will be effective December 1st and will be shown on the January utility bill. The new rate for residential customers is \$15.55, mobile homes \$12.65, multifamily \$18.95 and commercial is now consumption based. Even with the increase, Riverdale City still has one of the lowest rates when compared with other cities (Ogden's residential rate is \$22.41 and Roy's residential rate is \$16.25).

ROY COMPLEX DISCOUNT OFFER

In June, Riverdale City began offering discount passes to the Roy Complex as a benefit to residents. With this program the city will pay half of the cost of a discounted non-resident pass. The program has proven successful with over 125 passes purchased to date.

During the winter season the Roy Complex offers beneficial indoor recreational activities including a swimming pool, running track, basketball courts, weight room, exercise room, sauna, and racquetball courts. Discounted pass prices are:

TABLE TENNIS TOURNAMENT

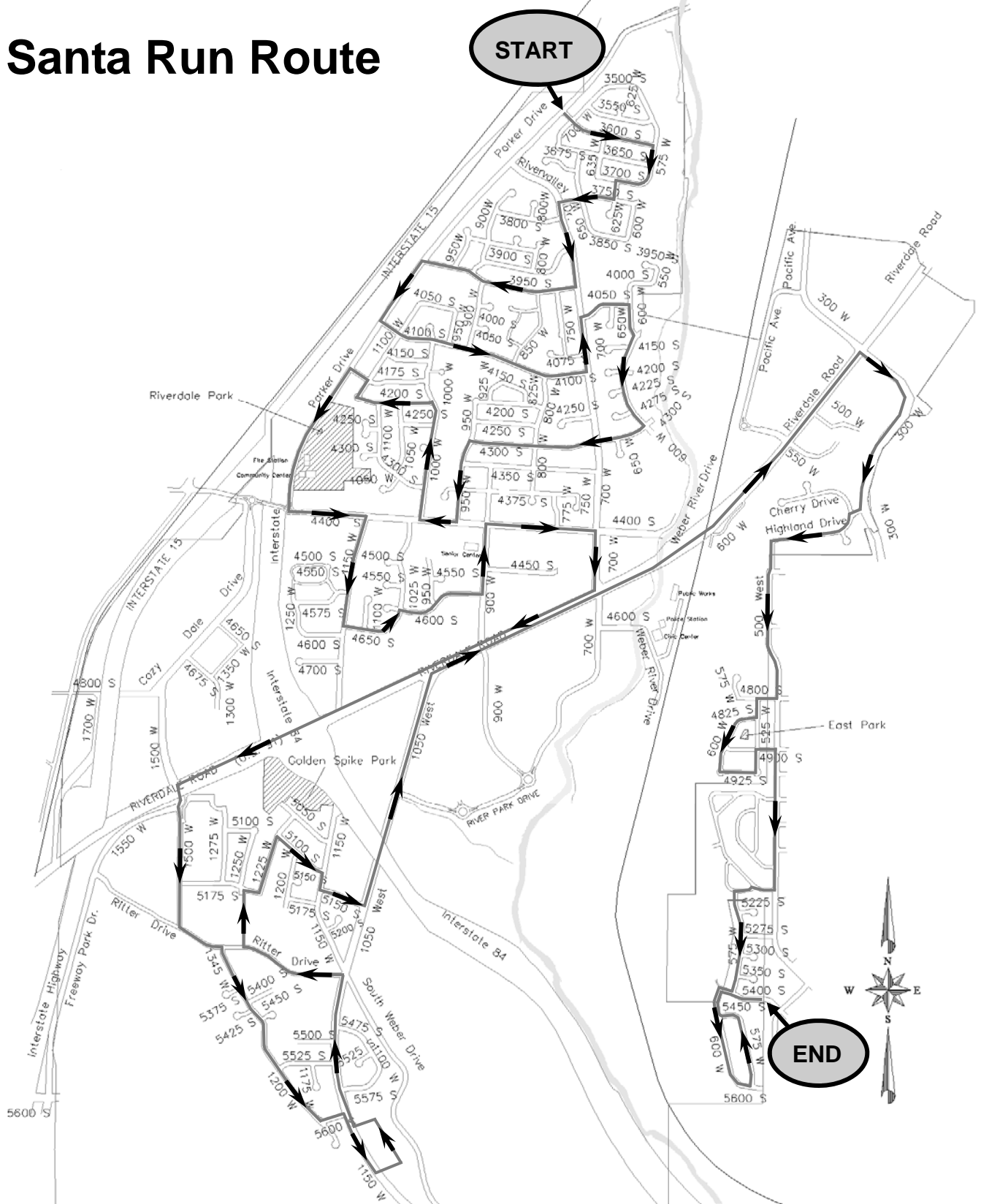

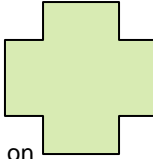


Santa Run Route

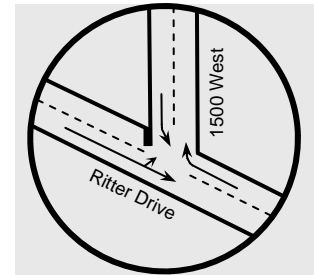
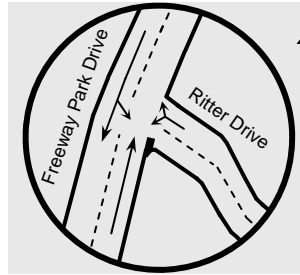
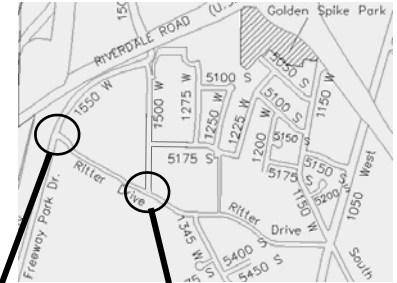
SNOW REMOVAL AND OTHER REMINDERS

- * It is the responsibility of the home owner, renter or business to clear sidewalks after each snowstorm. Doing so will allow for safer passage of those using the sidewalk.
- * City ordinance requires that cars be parked off the streets during winter nights and snow storms. Violators may be given a citation and their car may be towed.
- * Please blow or shovel the snow back onto your property, not into the street.
- * Please clear the snow from in front of your mailbox to allow for mail delivery.
- * Every effort is made to plow the streets as quickly as possible. Please exercise patience as main roads are cleared first followed by the subdivisions.



RITTER DRIVE CHANGES COMING

To alleviate an increasingly dangerous traffic situation, changes are coming to the traffic flow on Ritter Drive. Below are diagrams explaining the changes that will go into effect in the near future. The traffic flow at the intersection of Ritter Drive and Freeway Park Drive and Ritter Drive and 1500 West will be altered. Travelers should take note of the changes and prepare for the new Ritter Drive restrictions.



Freeway Park Drive and Ritter Drive Intersection

- Northbound traffic on Freeway Park Drive will not be allowed to turn right onto Ritter Drive.
- Southbound traffic on Freeway Park Drive will be allowed to turn left onto Ritter Drive.
- Local Ritter Drive traffic (residences between 1500 W. & Freeway Park Dr.) will be allowed to turn left or right onto Freeway Park Drive.

1500 West and Ritter Drive Intersection

- Southbound traffic on 1500 West is limited to left turn only and will not be allowed to turn right onto Ritter Drive.
- Westbound traffic on Ritter Drive must turn right onto 1500 West.
- Eastbound Ritter Drive residential traffic will be allowed to turn left onto 1500 West or continue eastbound on Ritter Drive.

WINTER STORM PREPAREDNESS TIPS

From the Riverdale Fire Department

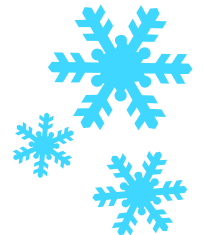
These are just a few tips to help get prepared for the up coming winter weather. Be Prepared...Before the Storm Strikes.

Have available at home and at work:

- * Flashlight and extra batteries
- * Extra food and water
- * Extra medicine and baby items
- * First-aid supplies
- * Battery-powered NOAA Weather / All Hazards receiver and portable radio
- * Heating fuel
- * Emergency heating source
- * Fire extinguisher
- * Smoke and Carbon Monoxide detectors

In vehicles (cars, trucks, snowmobiles):

- * Fully check and winterize your vehicle
- * Let someone know your itinerary
- * Keep your gas tank near full
- * Carry a cell phone
- * Carry a winter storm survival kit: blankets/ sleeping bags, flashlight, first-aid kit, knife, nonperishable food, extra clothing, a large empty can and plastic cover with tissues and paper towels for sanitary purposes, a smaller can and waterproof matches to melt snow for drinking water, sand, shovel, windshield scraper, tool kit, tow rope, booster cables, water container, and road maps.
