CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP

The Christmas tree pickup has been scheduled for Wednesday, January 9th. Trees must be placed near the sidewalk by 7:00 a.m. The tree stand must be removed and trees longer than 8' must be cut in half. Please ensure that the tree is not covered by snow. Crews will only be able to make one pass through the city, so please have your tree ready.



WINTERTIME REMINDERS

- ❄ It is required by city ordinance that homeowners, renters and businesses clear sidewalks in front of their property after each snowstorm. Doing so will allow for safer passage of those using the sidewalk.
- ❄ City ordinance requires that cars be parked off the streets during snow storms and winter nights. Violators may be cited and their car may be towed.
- ❄ Please blow or shovel the snow back onto your property, not into the street.
- ❄ Please clear the snow from in front of your mailbox to allow for mail delivery.
- ❄ Make sure that if there is a fire hydrant in front of your property that it can be easily spotted in case of emergency and is not covered by snow.
- ❄ Make sure that lawn sprinkler systems, swamp coolers, and outside faucets are properly winterized.
- ❄ Every effort is made to plow the streets as quickly as possible. Please exercise patience as main roads are cleared first followed by the subdivisions.

SCRAPBOOKING DAY

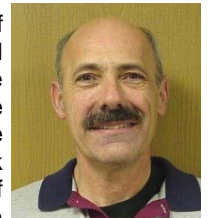
Scrapbooking Day at the Community Center is held on the second Saturday of every month from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. There is no charge. Come join us!
