RECYCLING SCHEDULE

The 2013 recycling pickup schedule and route map are available on the city website, www.riverdalecity.com. The city would like to remind residents to check the recycling pickup schedule to know when your pickup week is. A number of recycling cans are being placed at the curb for pickup on non-pickup weeks. The city is divided into two areas with pickup alternating each week between each area. This means that your recycle can is only picked up every other week. Please remember to check the schedule for when your pickup day is.

Our firefighters will be out trying to clear some of them off, but with 432 hydrants within Riverdale City, and only four firefighters on-duty at a time, we need your help. If you are unable to get a fire hydrant cleared, please call 801-394-7481, and we will come and help clear it.
