### NEW TOOL ADDED TO THE RDA HOUSING PROGRAM

In a continuing effort to improve the residential neighborhoods of the city, the Redevelopment Agency of Riverdale City (RDA) has implemented a new tool for the RDA Housing Program. This new tool is designed to assist with the conversion of homes with basement apartments into single family dwellings.



Homes that are located within an R-2 zone can receive an interest free loan of up to \$10,000 to use in converting their residence from a two family dwelling to a single family dwelling. The loan will not be due until the house is sold.

In addition, a home purchased within an R-2 zone that currently is used as a two family dwelling can receive a \$5,000 purchase assistance from the RDA with a commitment to utilize the residence as a single family dwelling.

This new tool will add to an already successful RDA Housing Program. Other aspects of the program include:

- **Improvement Loans:** This program provides no-interest or low-interest loans to homeowners. Loan proceeds must be used to make property improvements to owner occupied Riverdale residences such as: roofing, heating, plumbing, windows, repairs, etc. The improvement loans are available to homeowners who meet certain income guidelines. The maximum loan amount that can be borrowed by homeowners for home improvements is \$30,000 per loan.
- **Purchase Assistance Loan Program:** This program will provide purchase assistance for those buying a home located in specific target areas of the city.
- **Residential Relocation Program:** This program provides relocation assistance for homeowners residing within the 550 West RDA Project Area.

## THE BIG FIX ON TOUR COMING TO RIVERDALE

On Thursday, February 12<sup>th</sup> The Big Fix on Tour will be making a stop at the Riverdale Fire Station (4334 S. Parker Dr.). The Big Fix on Tour is a mobile spay/neuter clinic for dogs and cats at discounted prices.



Residents need to pre-register their dog/cat for surgery through the Riverdale Police Department by calling 394-6616. Registrations will be for Riverdale residents only until January 15<sup>th</sup>.

Animals need to be dropped off in the morning and picked up in the afternoon. Surgery can be performed on animals between the ages 8 weeks and 6 years old. Dogs need to be on a leash and cats must be in a carrier that is labeled with identification. Do not feed your dog/cat after 9 p.m. the night before if it is older than 4 months old or after 6 a.m. the morning of surgery if it is younger than 4 months old. Water is okay for both ages.

The prices for spaying/neutering are as follows:

- Female dog - \$60
- Male dog - \$50
- Female cat - \$35
- Male cat - \$25

Walk up microchipping and vaccinations are available to anyone while veterinarian is on the premises for a discounted fee. Vaccinations available include: dog or cat rabies, cat leukemia, dog and cat distemper combo.

### CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP

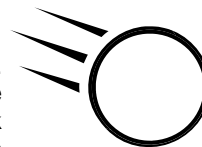
