Think of others this winter

Recently I have received many negative comments about people burning "trash" in their fireplaces or wood burning stoves. I spoke to our Fire Chief and learned that it is not only offensive, but it is illegal to burn trash in either a fireplace or wood burning stove. If you have done so in the past please stop and if you have thought about doing so, please do not. It can result in a fine for the offender and very bad air for everyone else, especially when there is an inversion.

Snow reminder

The snow season is upon us, even though we have not had much so far. When the snow does come please be courteous and cooperative with the snowplow drivers trying to make our roads safer. Some ideas are: don't park on the street (a law), take trash and recycle cans in as soon as possible after they are emptied, don't push snow from your driveway into the road, and clear the plowed snow from your driveway entrance and from in front of mailboxes soon after the streets are cleared so it doesn't harden into ice. Also, please be sure to keep sidewalks clear for the pedestrian traffic as well.

Recycling works

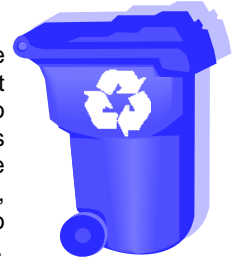

RECYCLE PROGRAM IS SUCCESSFUL

The Riverdale City Curbside Recycling Program is off to a great start. We appreciate all those who are participating in the program. As our residents continue to become familiar with our recycling program, our service provider would like to pass along the following information.



Helpful Hints on Recycling

- Buy or designate garbage receptacles around the house as "RECYCLE ONLY." Place where most recyclables are generated such as: kitchen, home office, family room, etc.
- Place a pick-up schedule and an acceptable recycle materials list where the family can refer to it. We have noticed recycle cans out on the off week.
- Review the acceptable recycle materials list with all household members. Also, remember that yard waste is not part of this program. **NO YARD WASTE.**
- Food and product containers to be recycled only need to be empty - **NOT RINSED.**
- Please have your cans out by 6:00 a.m. on your pickup day or the night before.
- When placed at the curb for pick-up, please keep a distance of a least five feet between all cans.

RDA HOUSING PROGRAM

The RDA Residential Loan Program was established to improve the residential areas of the city. The program has expanded over the years to include a variety of loan and purchase assistance programs including:



Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program: This home rehabilitation program provides no-interest or low-interest loans of up to \$30,000 to homeowners who meet certain income guidelines. Loan proceeds must be used to make property improvements to owner occupied Riverdale residences.

Safe Sidewalk Improvement Program: This program provides homeowners up to a \$5,000 loan for the repair, replacement, and improvement of residential sidewalks to mitigate safety hazards.

Purchase Assistance Loan Program: This program will provide purchase assistance for those buying a home located in specific target areas of the city.

"R-2" Conversion Program: For the Improvement and/or Purchase of Owner Occupied Properties located in an R-2 Zone that are converted from existing two-family to single-family dwellings.

HILL AIR FORCE BASE SEEKS COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVE

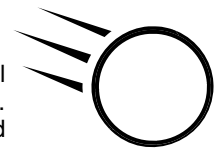
