Honoring Our Veterans

We have been trying for several years to find a way to honor our veterans who unselfishly served our country and each of us. The city council planned a monument to be at Riverdale Park with a stone or stones with names engraved on them. The plan was changed and a veteran's memorial committee was formed to look at ways to better honor them. In the process of forming the committee and enhancing the original plan, the idea of fund raising to pay for the additions to the monument was added. What got lost in the information given to the committee was the non-paid honoring of our veterans. I along with others felt that those who have given so much should not be forced to pay to have a name on the memorial as originally intended. We also want to respect the huge amount of work that has been done by our veteran's committee and believe that the enhancements are beautiful and worthy of support.



Support the Expansion

I believe after working with the committee, we have arrived at a wonderful solution. Those veterans or families who want an engraved name on the memorial as originally offered at no cost will be included along with other such names on 'common tiles.' Those who want to honor a veteran with an individual tile may purchase an individual tile for their recognition. There are two sizes of tiles available for purchase. The tiles can be purchased through the Riverdale Senior Center. The families or the individual may donate more if they want to help enhance the overall memorial. I support the fund raising efforts of the committee and plan to contribute even though none of my family from Riverdale has served.

We want to again thank our Veteran's Memorial committee for the great work they have done to make some very nice enhancements. I want to clear up the misperception that I may have given that we have received large donations. NEW ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

Riverdale City is teaming with SportSites to offer residents online registrations for city sports programs and facility rentals. This new addition to our online services will add a greater level of convenience for our residents.



The features of this new service include:

- **Youth Sports Registrations** - Register and pay for all youth sports programs including intramurals.
- **Adult Sports Registrations** - Register and pay for adult sports programs with the exception of the table tennis nights.
- **Park Pavilion Reservations** - Check availability, reserve and pay for large and small pavilions at Riverdale and Golden Spike Parks.
- **Meeting Room Rentals** - Check availability, reserve and pay for meeting rooms at the Community Center and Senior Center.

In addition to the ability to register for sports programs, users can visit the site to view team rosters, schedules, coach assignments, win/lose records, and sportsmanship points. The site will also allow users to check if there is a rainout or cancellation of a game. Residents can also view a yearly schedule of sports programs and their open registration dates.

To access this new online service, visit the city website at www.riverdalecity.com and select the online registrations and reservations button. From there you will be taken to the SportSites page. To register or make reservations, residents will need to set up an account with a user name using an email address and a password. This account can be used to register multiple children and will also retain your information for future registrations. Payments for registrations and reservations can be made at the secure site using a credit card.

The SportSites program will be available for use by the end of July. As an addition to our online services, it is hoped that residents will find this new service useful and convenient.

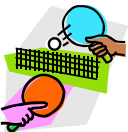


COMMUNITY CENTER TO BE CLOSED
