Riverdale Post Office

I, along with others have been frustrated for many years by the United States Postal Service. We have wanted and petitioned the Postal Service for our own Post Office branch here in Riverdale. We have tried every possible logic to get them to agree with our point of view. We have been told repeatedly that we have other locations in Ogden and Roy that are so close, that we cannot have one here. We even lost the one drop box that we had at one time, because, they said it was not used enough. The Post Office has been very reluctant to put a new drop box out or even evaluate a location for one anywhere in our city. Many of the businesses in the city advertise their location as Ogden because the Postal Service will not recognize Riverdale as a separate entity.

I do not have an answer for dealing with the Post Office. I do have, however, an answer for those who want to save time and travel and still receive the full benefits of the Post Office. The UPS Store that was formerly behind Conoco on Riverdale Road has moved north on 900 West. Wayne McAdams has incorporated all of the benefits of a Post Office within his store. You can buy stamps, post letters, ship packages not only UPS, but also United States Postal Service. He has Post Office boxes and many other services the same as the Post Office. He does have a variety of other services that are provided other places in the community such as mail drop off and copying, but he has many unique services that otherwise are only provided by the United States Post Office.

In the foreseeable future we will probably not have an official Post Office here in Riverdale, but if you want to have the same benefits with friendly customer service and at the same prices, try the UPS store at 4520 South 900 West across from the Riverdale Senior Center.

And thanks to all of you for what you do to make our City Great.

LAWN & GARDEN DIAGNOSTIC CLINICS

MOSQUITO SEASON HAS ARRIVED

Spring is here and with the arrival of warmer weather, the first hatches of mosquitoes are arriving. The Weber Mosquito Abatement District will again be doing their best to continue the aggressive evening and night time spraying. Their combination of aerial and ground spraying has proven to be the most successful in the state.



Even with their best efforts, it is still advisable to use mosquito repellent containing DEET if you or your family members are going to be out in the evening or night time hours. Always follow the instructions on the repellent when applying, especially with children.

If you are planning a special function, such as an outdoor wedding or family gathering, and are concerned about the presence of mosquitoes, give me a call at least a week in advance, and I will try to make sure the area is sprayed prior to the event. Have a good bug free summer.

- Do not block your mailbox.
