



### MAYOR'S CORNER

#### Riverdale Flooding 2011

We have had an unusual winter this year, with a lot of moisture in the fall before the freeze came, then a higher than normal amount of snow pack in the mountains. All of which have combined to make the soil saturation levels very high. On Monday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, a very heavy rainstorm added to the problems with over 2" of rain in the Morgan valley. In anticipation of the storm, the operators of the reservoirs shut down the flows for the Weber River, but the rains filled the drainages below the reservoirs. As a city, our Emergency Management Plan was in place and sandbags were filled in case they were needed. Fortunately, the river flood channel contained the water flow of the river. However, the rising water caused the groundwater levels to rise which affected eight homes in the River Glen subdivision. These homes experienced some water seepage into their basements. We truly regret that this happened, however due to the team efforts of our emergency team, CERT team members and volunteers, the damage was much less severe.

#### Thanks to all that have and will help

Once again, members of our community have stepped forward to serve. In addition to helping those whose homes received water, volunteers have been busy filling sandbags. Pallets of sandbags have been filled by volunteers at our Public Works Shop and in the parking lot of Home Depot which donated bags and sand. We extend our appreciation to all the volunteers who have provided help during this time of need. We have the greatest community anywhere!

#### Not out of the woods

We have not seen the last of the water for the year, but stand ready to assist anyone at any time in the future. The city continues to operate under our Emergency Management Plan. The river levels are monitored at various times around the clock both by computer flows at the mouth of Weber Canyon and by visual check. As of this writing, the Weber River Trail is open, however, a section on the south end has been washed away due to river flooding. We have also implemented a pumping system in the River Glen Subdivision to help diminish the potential of basement flooding. ### MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY



Riverdale City and the Veterans Committee would like to honor all of our Riverdale Veterans on Memorial Day. A ceremony will be held on May 30<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. at the Veterans Memorial located at the Civic Center, 4600 South Weber River Drive.

The ceremony will consist of a flag raising ceremony, with the newly designed Utah flag and the POW/MIA flag each hoisted on their own newly installed flag poles. There will be a short narration from Mayor Burrows and a wreath placed on the Memorial plaza, followed by Taps.

Also, new to the Memorial will be a bronze statue of Boots-Rifle-Helmet. The helmet and identification tags signify the fallen soldier. The inverted rifle with bayonet signals a time for prayer, and a break in the action to pay tribute to our comrades. The combat boots represent the final march of the last battle.
