I was made aware recently of another example of our staff providing quick thinking, swift action and great customer care. A Senior Center patron was standing at the reception counter in the foyer of the Senior Center when she fainted and fell backwards onto the floor. Mickie Layton our Senior Facility Manager heard the noise and rushed to help. She told the reception volunteer to call 911 and then knelt down at the side of the woman. The woman had regained consciousness and was making a motion with her hands showing that she was choking. Mickie quickly rolled the woman onto her side and slapped her back several times dislodging a large piece of bread the woman was choking on. This cleared the woman's airway and allowed her to breathe on her own again. Her quick actions undoubtedly kept a bad situation from going much worse and saved a life!

RECYCLE SERVICE FINAL OPT OUT PERIOD

We hope that residents participating in the city recycling service have found it to be a successful and worthwhile program. As stated when the program began, residents who desired to evaluate the service would then have a second opt out period after eight months. We are quickly approaching that second and final opt out period for the recycling service. **The final opt out period will be from June 1st to June 30th.**



Residents currently paying for recycling service, whether you have a can or not, who wish to eliminate the service and the \$2.45 charge may do so by filling out an opt out form and returning it to the city no later than June 30, 2012. If the city does not receive an opt out form from those currently receiving and being charged for recycling service then the service will become permanent. If you opted out of the recycling service when the program began and are not being charged the monthly fee, then you do not need to fill out another form.

TRAIL ENFORCEMENT

Spring is finally here and the Weber River is still flowing, (not flooding) thank goodness! The Riverdale trail system has become a very popular place to visit, walk, ride, and jog. Because it is so popular it has become necessary to beef up enforcement of city rules and ordinances concerning the trail system so that all can enjoy it. The patrons of the trail system have experienced less than desirable conditions such as dog droppings, dogs off leashes going after walkers and joggers, and bicyclists traveling too fast. The city has received numerous complaints regarding these problems.



In response to these problems we have asked Animal Control Officer Bonnie Jones to spend more time on the trail and to exercise zero tolerance for those not conforming to the rules of the trail. She will issue citations for any unleashed dogs on the trail. We will also be sending police officers multiple times each day to watch for offenders with a zero tolerance stance. We hope that by enforcing these laws residents will feel safer and enjoy their experiences on the trail. Please say "hi" to the officers and let them know you are glad they are there. We love working for Riverdale City. We want you to feel safe and hope you continue to enjoy living here in Riverdale and can continue to enjoy the trail way system.
