She said that Mr. Hansen was so helpful and because she was too timid to ask for much, he spent extra time with her to make sure that all of her needs were taken care of. She also stated because of the much improved outward appearance she is proud of her home again.

Another family expressed that they were reluctant to apply because they thought it was for much lower income levels than theirs. They are so excited to have new windows, roof, A.C. and other improvements to make their home much more efficient and attractive. These loans help our neighborhoods to be better kept and beautiful, more efficient and economical. Many have taken advantage of the program, many more need to find out if they can. Riverdale City Crossing Guards

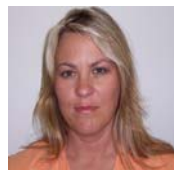
Each morning and afternoon the city Crossing Guards are on duty to ensure our children safe passage to and from school. This month we would like to recognize them for the great job they do.

THE RIVERDALE POLICE CAR FLEET

We as a police department are occasionally asked questions about our fleet of police cars. Below are the questions we get and our responses.



Why did you switch to an all black look? Although I love the traditional black and white look, we feel it necessary to be fiscally responsible with your tax dollars. The all black fleet cost less up front and the resale value is greater. By having an all black fleet we saved thousands of dollars per vehicle.

Why did you choose the Dodge Charger? This vehicle has the best of both worlds for an emergency patrol vehicle. The hemi engine will get the officer to the scene quickly, yet the multi-displacement engine runs on only four cylinders when all eight cylinders are not needed, thus saving money by using far less gas. We also had quite a few problems with the Ford Crown Victoria.

Why did you switch to LED light bars? Although more expensive initially, the LED light bars last twice as long as the standard light bar and are much brighter.

Why are administration vehicles not standard fleet vehicles? We have chosen this route because of the resale value of the higher end vehicles. Utilizing the state bid system, we are able to purchase these vehicles at a discounted price. We then drive them two years and sell them for nearly the price we paid.

Please feel free to talk to our officers about their cars and get their responses. We enjoy working for Riverdale City and it is obvious that the city cares for its employees. We enjoy serving you and welcome any suggestions you may have.
