VETERANS DAY CEREMONY

STORM WATER PLAN APPROVED

At the October 18th City Council meeting an updated Storm Water Management Plan was approved. This plan details the efforts by the city to reduce the amount of pollutants that enter into the storm water system.



Storm water is carried by gutters into storm drains which drain directly into the Weber River. The storm drain system is essential in preventing localized flooding from heavy rain and melting snow. Because the storm water enters the Weber River untreated efforts must be made to prevent pollutants from entering into the storm drain system.

Residents are asked to always remember that anything washed into the gutter will end up in the storm drain system and drain directly into the Weber River. Please do not allow contaminants to be washed into the storm drain system. Examples of contaminants include: draining a radiator and washing the antifreeze into the gutter, cleaning a paint brush in the gutter, grass clippings, and excess lawn fertilizer washed into the gutter.

Please exercise caution and remember, storm drains are for excess rain runoff, not for dumping waste. The city has set up an illicit discharge hotline number at 801-394-5541 ext. 1201 (in case of emergency call 911). WINTERIZE YOUR SPRINKLER SYSTEM

Our Public Works Department would like to remind residents to winterize your lawn sprinkler systems before the freezing temperatures begin. This can be done by draining or blowing out with an air compressor any water that remains in the sprinkler lines. Sprinkler lines are typically not buried deep enough to prevent freezing. Each spring we have residents surprised by large water bills due to unknown leaks in their lawn sprinkler system caused by broken lines that froze during the winter. Please avoid the cost of excess water usage and the repair of your sprinkler system by properly winterizing your system.
