MAYOR'S CORNER

River Restoration Efforts

We have had a construction team working to complete river restoration projects for several weeks and look forward to their completed work in the very near future. There are many complex situations that were created by the flooding a year ago. It has taken much longer to get to the point of restoration than we anticipated. Working with FEMA and other agencies to secure matching dollars to make repairs has been a large undertaking all by itself. We are satisfied with the work to date and hope the areas now underway will be completed soon. Thanks for your patience and cooperation.

A Boon to the West Bench Project Area of Riverdale

After many long years of trying, Riverdale has been awarded a budget for the RDA "West Bench Project Area." It was originally proposed in 2005, but we were one vote short of getting a budget to help the area develop properly. The major stumbling block to development in this area is the Rocky Mountain transmission power lines that cross several pieces of property along the west bench. With the agreement by the various taxing entities in our county, we can now move forward to work with the landowners and developers to assemble the parcels of property to make it a successful and productive area of the city. I want to personally thank Larry Hansen and our city staff, principally Ember Herrick our City Recorder and Randy Daily our Community Development Director for this successful effort many years in the making.

Repeat Request

As I have mentioned several times in the past, we have a need to be ever vigilant about our trail, our neighborhoods, and our animals. We had started to do a much better job about cleaning up after our animals on the trail and along city streets during their walks, but we have had reports that prompt me to again make everyone aware of the continuing problem of animal waste not picked up by pet owners. The city ordinances state that you must have your animals on a leash and that you are responsible for cleaning up behind them as they make deposits on our walkways and in people's yards. Animals are not permitted to be free roaming and are subject to impoundment if they do so. The bigger problem seems to be the unwillingness of the owners to not pick up the waste even when bags and receptacles are provided on the trails. I hear the complaints and must agree with those individuals when they say some animal owners do not even carry bags with them and it is obvious they have no intention of cleaning up after their pets. I strongly urge you to be good citizens by carrying bags to use and keeping our trails and our neighborhood yards free from animal waste.

WINTERIZE YOUR SPRINKLER SYSTEM

Our Public Works Department would like to remind residents to winterize your lawn sprinkler systems before the freezing temperatures settle in. This can be done by draining or blowing out with an air compressor any water that remains a in the sprinkler lines. Sprinkler lines are typically not buried deep enough to prevent freezing. Each spring we have



residents surprised by large water bills due to unknown leaks in their lawn sprinkler system caused by broken lines that froze during the winter.

If you have a swamp cooler, please remember to winterize it as well. Please be sure to turn off the water line running to the swamp cooler at the valve. This will prevent freezing and leaking due to a broken water line. Please avoid the cost of excess water usage and the repair of your sprinkler system or swamp cooler by properly winterizing your systems.

START EARLY TO BE PREPARED FOR WINTER

Things to do and items to have available in your home:

- Get your furnace checked by a certified heating contractor.
- · Clean your chimney if you burn wood or coal.
- Ensure smoke and carbon monoxide detectors work and have new batteries.
- Have a flashlight and portable radio with extra batteries on
- Store extra food, water, medicine, and baby items.
- Keep first-aid supplies on hand.
- · Have an emergency heating source and heating fuel.
- Keep a fire extinguisher in your home.

In vehicles (cars, trucks, snowmobiles):

- · Fully check and winterize your vehicle.
- Carry a winter storm survival kit with tools and emergency supplies.
- Keep vour gas tank near full.
- · Carry a cell phone.
- Let someone know your itinerary.
