Riverdale Lions Club Serving Riverdale Since 1953

At the October 7th Meeting of the Riverdale City Council, Riverdale Lions Club President, Teresa Knight and past president, Joseph Thompson, presented Riverdale City with a check for \$750.00 to be used toward the purchase of a large decorative rock to be placed at the 700 West roundabout. This is one of many contributions made to the city by the Riverdale Lions Club. During the building of the Riverdale Veterans Memorial in 2010, the Lions Club donated \$1,000.00 toward the building of the memorial. They also helped with a Veterans Memorial Fundraising Breakfast by purchasing the food and cooking the breakfast. The Lions Club then donated the profits to the Veterans Memorial Committee, which was a significant amount. The Lions Club has also donated and installed benches at the Golden Spike and Riverdale Parks. In addition, the Lions Club purchased and installed metal storage shelves at the Senior Center. The Lions Club cooks and serves a fundraising breakfast each July 4th in the Riverdale Park as part of Riverdale's Old Glory Days Celebration.



One of the purpose of Lions Clubs is to help the blind and people with eyesight problems. During the past year the Riverdale Lions Club has tested the eyes of kindergarten children at Riverdale Elementary School and other elementary schools with sophisticated equipment. They also collect eye glasses that are then distributed to those needing eyeglasses in all parts of the world. Glasses are purchased for those unable to buy them. Riverdale Lions Club members act as couriers for eye tissue needed by the Moran Eye Center in Salt Lake City. Members of our Riverdale Lions Club have done and are still doing a great service. RIVERDALE ROAD FINISHED

It may be hard to remember when a section of Riverdale Road was not under construction. The reconstruction of Riverdale Road began with phase one from I-84 to the Weber River viaduct back in 2008. Phase two followed, completing the section from the viaduct to Chimes View Drive. The third and final phase from the I-84 interchange to 1900 West In Roy is now finishing up.

As of this writing, UDOT plans are to have all lanes of the road open by November 8th. UDOT and the construction crews have worked hard and have done a great job at making improvements to the Riverdale Road corridor.

TIME TO WINTERIZE

Our Public Works Department would like to remind residents to winterize your lawn sprinkler systems before the freezing temperatures settle in. This can be done by draining or blowing out with an air compressor any water that remains in the sprinkler lines. Sprinkler lines are typically not buried deep enough to prevent freezing. Each spring we have residents surprised by large water bills due to unknown leaks in their lawn sprinkler system caused by broken lines that froze during the winter.



If you have a swamp cooler, please remember to winterize it as well. Please be sure to turn off and drain the water line running to the swamp cooler at the valve. This will prevent freezing and leaking due to a broken water line. Please avoid the cost of excess water usage and the repair of your sprinkler system or swamp cooler by properly winterizing your systems.

KEEP STREET GUTTERS CLEAN

The leaves have begun their annual descent, covering the lawns, driveways, and sidewalks. As you clean up the leaves please remember to also clean the leaves out of the street gutters in front of your home. Leaves left in the street gutters will cause two problems:



First, leaves can be washed down the street gutter and accumulate in the storm drain system. This can cause the storm drains to become clogged leading to potential flooding during a heavy rain.

Second, as Public Works performs the street sweeping, accumulated leaves in the street gutters will greatly reduce the ability of the sweeper to properly clean the street and can also cause the machine to become clogged.

Please remember to clean your street gutters as you clear your yard of fallen leaves. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

START EARLY TO BE PREPARED FOR WINTER

Below are tips to help you prepare for the coming winter months:



Things to do and items to have available in your home:

- Get your furnace checked by a certified heating contractor.
- Clean your chimney if you burn wood or coal.
- Have a flashlight and portable radio with extra batteries on hand.
- Have an emergency heating source and heating fuel.
- Keep a fire extinguisher in your home.
- Store extra food, water, medicine, first-aid supplies, and baby items.
- Ensure smoke and carbon monoxide detectors work and have new batteries.
- Keep first-aid supplies on hand.

In vehicles (cars, trucks, snowmobiles):

- Fully check and winterize your vehicle.
- Carry a winter storm survival kit with tools and emergency supplies.
- Keep your gas tank near full.
- Carry a cell phone.
- Let someone know your itinerary.
