RIVERDALE RECYCLING

Several years ago, the city began a recycling program. At that time, recycling centers paid the haulers of our recycling material about \$25.00 per ton for the material. The city didn't make any money, but the money received helped to offset the pickup and hauling cost. Since that time, the market value of the recycling material has dropped significantly and the city is paying nearly \$40.00 per ton to dump the material at recycling centers. We are paying the same tipping fees as we do for the solid waste (black cans) at the transfer station. Worldwide, there is a glut of material and very little demand. China used to purchase much of the world's recycling material, but due to different manufacturing strategies, they have ceased buying large quantities. Some of the recycling material collected in the U.S. is being sent as far away as Vietnam and India. This is very expensive and drives the cost up to dump the recycling material.

Some neighboring cities are looking to discontinue their recycling programs. For now, Riverdale City is weathering the storm and keeping an eye on the market value as new uses and processes are being developed to use the material. One new process makes an energy fuel out of recycled plastics and fiber (paper) that is manufactured in the form of pellets and burns like coal, only the pellets burn clean unlike coal. There is a good market for this new fuel as it is used in industrial coal-fired furnaces, like the ones used at the cement plant in Croydon, a short distance up Weber Canyon. A company that is building these plants is interested in building one to serve Weber and Davis Counties. This may or may not materialize.

In the meantime, the most important thing we can do is keep our recycling material clean as we put it out for pickup. Paper, cardboard, plastics, and cans should be as clean as possible when put in the blue cans for pickup. Absolutely no plastic bags of any type as they plug up the machines that sort the material. Any food of any type on the material is also a no-no! Contaminated loads of recycled material can be refused at the recycling centers. We need your help to cleanup what we would like to recycle. This will help strengthen the market.

Emergency Preparedness

STEPS TO PREPARE FOR WINTER



Below are tips to help you prepare for the coming winter months:

Things to do and items to have available in your home:

- Get your furnace checked by a certified heating contractor.
- Clean your wood/coal burning chimney.
- Have a flashlight and portable radio with extra batteries on hand.
- Have an emergency heating source and heating fuel.
- Keep a fire extinguisher in your home.
- Store extra food, water, medicine, and baby items.
- Ensure smoke and carbon monoxide detectors work and have new batteries.
- Keep first-aid supplies on hand.

In vehicles (cars, trucks, snowmobiles):

- Fully check and winterize your vehicle.
- Carry a winter storm survival kit with tools and emergency supplies.
- Keep your gas tank near full.
- Carry a cell phone.
- Let someone know your itinerary.

WINTER PARKING ON CITY STREETS

As a reminder to assist in keeping our roads clear of snow so we can all get around the city safer and easier, please keep these ordinances in mind. Riverdale City Ordinance 6-4-4 reads, "when snow removal becomes necessary, no person who owns or has possession, custody or control of any vehicle or other object shall park or place such vehicle, or object upon or immediately adjacent to any street travelway until the street is cleared." We make every reasonable attempt to try and gain compliance with removing vehicles, trailers and other objects from the city streets without issuing citations or impounding vehicles. However, if we cannot find the owner, or other responsible person to move the vehicle to facilitate snow removal, you may be subject to a citation and impoundment of the vehicle or object.



Also, 6-4-5 states that it is unlawful to park, or leave standing on the street any unattached trailer, boat, camper, motor home etc. unless it is being loaded for departure and can only be left for loading for a period not to exceed 72 hours.

Please help us now with removing anything from the streets that should not be there and help us with not parking vehicles on the street during a snowstorm, or immediately following a snowstorm until the roads are cleared. Thank you for your cooperation.

BOYS BASKETBALL REGISTRATION

Boys basketball registration is now taking place for the Boys 3rd-6th grades and 7th-9th grades and will go from November 1st - November 30th.

Coach needs to be at least 21. There will be a mandatory coaches meeting.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

TIME TO WINTERIZE



We would like to remind residents to winterize your lawn sprinkler systems before the freezing temperatures settle in. This can be done by draining or blowing out with an air compressor any water that remains in the sprinkler lines. Sprinkler lines are typically not buried deep enough to prevent freezing. Each spring we have residents surprised by large water bills due to unknown leaks from broken lines that froze during the winter.

If you have a swamp cooler, please remember to winterize it as well. Turn off and drain the water line running to the swamp cooler at the valve. This will prevent leaking due to a broken water line.

Avoid the cost of excess water usage and the repair of your systems by properly winterizing your systems.

AIR FORCE OFFERS AIR SAMPLING IN RIVERDALE



Hill Air Force Base has begun contacting homes and businesses near areas of groundwater contamination coming from the base, to notify them that potentially harmful chemical vapors from the groundwater could be entering their homes or workplaces. Those in the affected areas will receive a certified letter from the Air Force explaining the issue and providing instructions on how to have the air inside the home or business tested. Tests will begin in October and go through March of 2019. If vapors are found above established action levels, the Air Force will take steps to prevent those vapors from entering the home or building. The drinking water has not been affected by the contamination.

The Air Force has been testing the air inside homes around Hill since 2003. As always, the testing is free, as are any future mitigation efforts. If you do not receive a certified letter, your home or business is not within an area of concern. 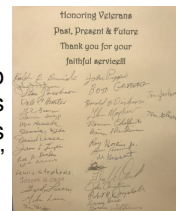


FALL SALE AND CHRISTMAS DÉCOR SALE
