ELECTION VOTING DATES

Early voting will begin two weeks before the General Election. The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 3rd. Voting dates and times are as follows:

VOTING LOCATION - COMMUNITY CENTER

Voting for all precincts, for both the Early Voting and the General Election, will take place at the Riverdale Community Center, 4360 S. Parker Drive.

I.D. REQUIRED

New this year, voters must present a photo ID for both the early voting and general election voting. The name and address on the photo ID must match the voter registration records kept by the County. If the name and/or address doesn't match the County's records, the voter may show 2 forms of ID containing the new information and will be allowed to cast a provisional ballot. ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS

If you make your utility bill payment electronically through your banking institution, please note the following: **It takes 7 to 10 days for the payment to get to the city.** Because of this delay, some residents have received delinquent notices for nonpayment. To avoid this situation, please make your electronic payment far enough in advance so that payment is received by the due date. This delay does not apply for those who make payments online at the city website or for those who use Direct Pay through the city.

HOME PROBLEMS?

Is your home in need of repairs this winter? The RDA Residential Loan Program may be able to help. The Program provides low-interest and no-interest loans of up to \$30,000 to property owners who meet certain income guidelines. Loan proceeds must be used for property improvements.
