PROPERTY TAX IN RIVERDALE

Each year we are faced with paying our property taxes during the month of November. We receive a "Property Valuation Notice" from the Weber County Clerk's office a few months before, which gives us information regarding the "proposed tax" for the year. I looked at this year's "valuation notice" with interest as I looked to see how our property tax would be distributed among the taxing entities within Weber County. The property tax on our home this year is nearly \$1300.00. I found it interesting to note, that of the \$1300.00 in taxes, Riverdale City will receive \$126.00, which amounts to \$10.50 per month. I was surprised to see the small portion of the tax that actually went to the city. The largest portion of the property tax we pay goes for education, the rest to other entities within the county.

KUDOS TO OUR LAW ENFORCEMENT FOLKS!

A very special thanks to the Riverdale Police Department, Weber County Homicide Task Force, CSI and other supporting agencies for their firm resolve to solve a homicide that occurred along the river trail on Sunday morning, September 13th. The body of a young man was found along the trail, by a jogger, before sunrise that morning. The victim had been shot to death. I visited the crime scene that morning and was told the identity of the victim was unknown at the time and the investigators didn't have much to go on. By sundown, that same evening, a suspect, who had been picked up and questioned by Riverdale Police was in custody and behind bars. The suspect lived in a trailer park close to the trail and was an acquaintance of the victim. The crime may be drug related. I understand this was the first homicide in our city in about 30 years. All in all, our law enforcement folks did a superb job of solving this crime in a minimum amount of time and deserve a vote of thanks. We sincerely appreciate the efforts of all involved. It was truly a team effort and a job well done!

DID YOU KNOW?

- It took 177 years for Utah to reach 1 million residents, and just 35 years to reach 2 million more residents. The population today is 2.9 million. Utah's population will double between today and 2060, to about 6 million residents, with 80% of that growth occurring along the Wasatch Front and in Washington County.
- 111 cities and towns and 17 counties acted to put Proposition 1 on the ballot in 2015, representing 86% of the population. Proposition 1 is a sales tax initiative that would provide funding for transportation improvements.

ELECTION INFORMATION

Riverdale City will be holding a "Vote by Mail" General Election for City Council candidates. Residents who are registered to vote will be mailed the official General Election ballot beginning early October.



There are three City Council seats up for vote. Each seat carries a four-year term. Residents can vote for three candidates, one for each open seat.

Voting is as simple as 1, 2, or 3:

#1: Mail in your ballot by affixing a first class stamp and depositing it in the mail. All ballots must be postmarked no later than November 2, 2015.

#2: Ballots can also be dropped off at a secure ballot drop box at the Riverdale Civic Center, 4600 South Weber River Drive, Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

#3: The Election Day Vote Center will allow those who did not receive their ballot to vote in person at the Civic Center on November 3, 2015, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Mail-in Ballots can also be dropped off that day during the same hours.

If you do not receive a ballot in the mail or misplace your ballot, contact Weber County's Elections Office immediately at 801-399-7411.

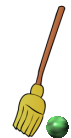
HELP WANTED
