



MAYOR'S CORNER

TORNADO CLEANUP AND RECOVERY

On Thursday, September 22nd, an unexpected EF-1 tornado touched down in Riverdale uprooting trees and signs, knocking out power to homes, terrorizing many residents, and severely damaging several homes on Riverdale's east bench which borders Washington Terrace. Some of the homes were damaged to the extent they were no longer inhabitable. Emergency service teams quickly responded from Riverdale City and many surrounding communities. Miraculously, no one was killed or seriously injured and only a few suffered minor injuries. Damage in Riverdale, Washington Terrace, and South Ogden was estimated to be in the millions of dollars.



On Thursday evening, despite heavy rains that lasted for about thirty-six hours, a massive cleanup and recovery began. Cleanup equipment arrived from many neighboring cities, some as far away as Clearfield and Plain City. Many, many volunteers, including cadets from the Utah Military Academy, the Job Corp, Weber County Jail inmates, and large numbers of organized church groups, worked tirelessly in the rain, with city crews, to remove fallen trees, and other debris from effected neighborhoods. The response was overwhelming and within 48 hours much of the debris had been cleaned up and hauled to green waste facilities. The American Red Cross was on the scene and along with other types of assistance, arranged for hotel lodging for displaced residents. Many local businesses, including Sam's Club, Chick-fil-A, Home Depot, Costco and others graciously offered and supplied food and other supplies to those supporting the cleanup and recovery. The overall response and willingness to help was eye watering. The efforts of so many are greatly appreciated. As this article is being written, our greatest concerns are for those who have been displaced from their homes and for the extensive damage to several residences. This recovery will take much longer.

"BONNEVILLE CTC" COALITION RECEIVES AWARD

I attended the Utah State Fall Substance Abuse Conference that was held in St. George during the third week of September. During the awards ceremony on Thursday, September 22nd, our Bonneville Communities the Care (CTC) was awarded the prestigious "Coalition of the Year" award. The coalition was formed six years ago by the cities of Riverdale, South Ogden, Uintah, and Washington Terrace. These cities all send students to Bonneville High School after which the coalition was named. The coalition has made great strides as they work to prevent underage use of alcohol and tobacco and to prevent the use of drugs and unwanted pregnancies. Kudos to the coalition for being recognized with this award. Great job by a lot of fine people!

4400 SOUTH PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE WALKWAY UPDATE

This walkway, currently under construction, is rapidly moving along and is expected to be completed by November 4th. The bridge, which will span I-15 has arrived by truck, in six sections, from Minnesota, is being assembled and will probably be placed about the third week of October. We are planning to hold a grand opening/ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the opening of the new walkway. This ceremony will be announced at a later date.

FALL CLEANUP



Our annual fall cleanup this year will be a curbside pickup, the same as the spring cleanup. Residents will be allowed to put their items out on the curb beginning October 7th. Curbside pickup will begin on October 10th. Please have items on the curb by 6:00 a.m. of the 10th for pickup, as we cannot return.

The following rules will be enforced:

- All material must be loadable by hand without the use of heavy equipment.
- Have items bundled together or bagged.
- Tree branches must be cut in lengths of 5' or less and must be tied together in tight bundles not to exceed 50 lbs. Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.
- Loose items such as leaves, weeds, grass and shrub trimmings need to be placed in bags or suitable disposable containers.
- Individual refuse items must weigh less than 50 lbs.
- Not accepted: construction material, wood, sheetrock, concrete, sod, soil, rocks, highly volatile material, lead products, asbestos, hazardous waste, refrigerators.
- Do not block mailboxes or fire hydrants.
- Items not meeting requirements will not be picked up.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Improve your Halloween safety this year by:

Costumes: When choosing a costume, stay away from billowing or long-trailing fabric. If you are making your own costume, choose material that won't easily ignite if it comes into contact with heat or flame.



Visibility: Provide children with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costumes. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he/she can see clearly out of it.

Flammable decorations: Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper are highly flammable. Keep these and other decorations well away from all open flames and heat sources, including light bulbs and heaters.

Candles / jack-o-lanterns: It is safest to use a glow stick or battery-operated candle in a jack-o-lantern. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. When lighting candles inside jack-o-lanterns, use long fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. If you choose to use candle decorations, make sure to keep them well attended at all times. Do not leave them near flammable objects or where trick-or-treaters may walk. Remind your children to avoid open flames. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit.

Exits: Remember to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.

Weber County is conducting the 2016 general election by mail, which means all active voters will be mailed a ballot on October 18th. Your ballot should arrive in your mail box by October 25th. There is a drop box located at the Riverdale City Civic Center, 4600 South Weber River Drive, which will be open on October 18th.



Federal law prevents the Post Office from forwarding ballots, so it is important that your registration is up to date. If your registration is current, no further action is required. You can verify your information at <https://vote.utah.gov> and select the "My Voter Profile" tab. To update your information, click on the green "Register to Vote" button on the right hand side of the page. Please register at your current address (you may include a mailing address if applicable). Paper registration forms are available at www.WeberElections.com or in person at the Weber County Clerk/Auditor office.
