FALL CLEANUP SCHEDULED

Our Fall Cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, October 8th. Roll off dumpsters will be placed at the following locations for residents to bring items for disposal.



- Riverdale Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- Golden Spike Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- 525 West 4800 South 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

At each location, there will be a dumpster for green waste and one for other items. When unloading, follow these steps:

- Tree limbs must be tied into bundles 6 feet long or less.
- Please bring enough help to unload quickly.
- Children must remain in vehicles for safety reasons.
- Items not accepted: tires, chemicals, paint, dirt, concrete, rocks, batteries, pesticides, drums, and hazardous waste.

Hazardous Waste Disposal

Although hazardous waste is not accepted at the cleanup locations, there are several options available to residents for disposal:

- **Les Schwab Tire** located at 627 Riverdale Road will accept used tires, batteries, and oil from Riverdale residents.
- **Weber County Transfer Station** located at 867 W. Wilson Lane will be holding a hazardous waste disposal day on September 17th, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS

Fire restrictions continue to be in place along the Weber River corridor within city boundaries. The restrictions include no open fires, no open flames, no cigarettes, and no fireworks along the river corridor. The restrictions have been put in place due to the heavy vegetation along the river corridor which is now drying out due to hotter temperatures. A map of the restricted area can be viewed on the city website, www.riverdalecity.com. The restrictions will continue to be in effect until October 31, 2011.



CURBSIDE RECYCLING INFORMATION

Delivery of the new recycling cans is scheduled to begin in the first part of October. Recycling cans will be delivered to all residents who currently receive curbside garbage collection service from Riverdale City (with the exception of those residents who have opted out of the recycling service).



When recycling collection begins, the city will be divided into two sections with each section being picked up on an every-other-week basis. A map detailing when each area of the city is scheduled for pick up will be included when the can is delivered. Residents are advised to place the recycling can out at curbside on the Tuesday night before scheduled collection. The recycling can will be picked up by a separate truck from the regular garbage can, so the time of the collection will be different.

The list will also be included with the information packet when the recycle cans are delivered. More details will be published in the October city newsletter and on the city website as it becomes available.
