MAYOR'S CORNER

The Weber County RAMP program is a fantastic initiative that benefits communities like ours across the County. RAMP stands for Recreation, Arts, Museums, and Parks, and it's a program funded through a modest 0.1% sales tax on qualifying purchases made within Weber County. This tax, which has been in place since voters first approved it in 2004, generates revenue specifically dedicated to enhancing recreational facilities, cultural organizations, arts programs, museums, and parks throughout the county. It's a way for all of us—residents, businesses, and visitors alike—to chip in and support the quality of life that makes Weber County special.



Each year, cities like Riverdale, along with other local entities and nonprofit organizations, participate in a competitive grant process to secure funding for projects that align with RAMP's mission. It's a collaborative effort: we submit detailed applications outlining our proposed projects, and a RAMP Tax Advisory Board reviews them, scores them based on established criteria, and makes recommendations to the Weber County Commission for final approval. The process is thorough, ensuring that the funds go to projects that will have a meaningful impact on our communities.

Recently, Riverdale has had only modest success at obtaining RAMP grants and had only been applying sporadically over the past few years. We decided to renew our efforts and figure out how to be successful. We did some research, and tried to pick a few projects that had a high probability of being approved. We were successful in getting two approved for a total of just over \$60,000. We also learned a lot about what the board is looking for when a project is proposed. We received about \$22,000 that will be used toward our Old Glory Days Celebration for the 4th of July. We also received funding for an exciting outdoor classroom feature that will be constructed at the Riverdale Park.

This success has reinvigorated our desire to apply for grants, and we are currently looking for other funding opportunities for Riverdale facilities. I can't help myself from getting excited about some of the possibilities. The RAMP process will begin again towards the end of the year with an application deadline in mid-January. If you have specific suggestions or ideas for projects for the next cycle, please share them with the City. We look forward to seeing these current projects completed and hearing your ideas for new projects.

SPRING CLEANUP SCHEDULED FOR APRIL

Our annual spring cleanup has been scheduled for April 21st - 22nd. The cleanup will be a curbside pickup again this year. Residents will be allowed to put their items out on the curb in front of their house from April 18th - 21st.

- Items must be set out by 6:00 a.m. on Monday, April 21st.
- The maximum amount per residence will be the equivalent of two pickup truck loads.
- All material must be loadable by hand without the use of heavy equipment.
- Please have items bundled together or bagged.
- Tree branches must be cut in lengths of five feet or less and must be tied together in tight bundles not to exceed 50 lbs. Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.
- Loose items such as leaves, weeds, grass and shrub trimmings need to be placed in bags or suitable disposable containers.
- Individual refuse items must weigh less than 50 lbs.
- Not accepted: construction material, wood, sheet-rock, concrete, sod, soil, rocks, highly volatile material, lead products, asbestos, hazardous waste, refrigerators, tires.
- Do not block mailboxes or fire hydrants.
- Items not meeting requirements will not be picked up.

Spring Code Enforcement

It's that time of the year again when spring is approaching fast. Riverdale is one of the most desirable places to live, work and shop in all of Weber County. Residents of Riverdale City take pride in their homes and work hard to keep them safe and clean. We ask all residents to "do your part" to police your homes for overgrown weeds and vegetation. Use water wisely to maintain our lawns and planters. Install drought resistant vegetation wherever possible, and as always, keep your home free of trash and accumulation of unsightly debris.

Code Enforcement will be out in the community, reminding residents to maintain their property according to Riverdale City Ordinances and ensuring that our city is attractive to not only our residents, but visitors as well. Some of you may receive a door hanger as a warning to please maintain your property to stay compliant with Riverdale Ordinances. Code Enforcement will enforce City Ordinances, up to a citation, as a last resort. However, we strive to attain compliance through cooperation with all our residents and businesses.

FIRE HYDRANT TESTING

The Riverdale Fire Department will be testing fire hydrants in the city from May to June. This test is designed to capture static and flow pressure readings to discover any potential fire hydrant performance issues for corrective action. The fire hydrant inspection also includes any maintenance the hydrant may require. The annual test and maintenance is also an important component of the Insurance Service Office grading of fire protection for the community, which results in lower fire insurance premiums for your home and business property.



Residents should check to be sure there is no discoloration, due to sediment in the line, before using any water during this period. If discoloration of water is noted after testing in their area, residents should allow their cold water taps to flow until the water clears. This will prevent any problems with the washing of clothes and dishes. If the discoloration remains or you see a problem with a fire hydrant, please call the Riverdale City Water Department at 801-394-5541 ext.1201.

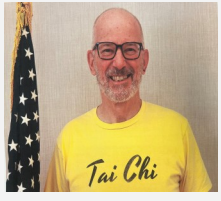
SENIOR CENTER ACTIVITIES
