

#### **MAYOR'S CORNER**

Four years ago in March 2020, we had the start of the Covid 19 pandemic and also a significant earthquake. I think that is why I associate the month of March with emergency preparedness. I have discussed in previous newsletters some of the risks that Riverdale faces because of the proximity to the airport, rail yard, river, freeway, and Air Force Base.



During the first part of February 2024, there have been significant earthquakes in California, Hawaii, and Oklahoma. Large earthquakes are obviously a risk that we face here in Riverdale. I have been thinking lately about the large number of bridges that are found within our City. I was amazed at the number of bridges we have for such a small city. While thinking about the bridges, I realized there is a large portion of the City that could be cut off from medical care if an event such as an earthquake were to destroy the bridges. There would also be a risk that our Public Works and Public Safety workers would not be able to get into the City or access their equipment to help the residents.

The City, in conjunction with the County and State, is currently evaluating the condition of our local bridges and will remedy or replace them as needed. In the event of a large earthquake, they may still be impassable. I would encourage residents to take some time this month to evaluate their emergency supplies. I keep a fair amount of supplies and equipment, but I am not as good as I once was at making sure it is in working order and not out of date. Obtaining emergency skills is also a good option. As I mentioned, medical care may be difficult to access. Knowing some basic first aid and having a first aid kit could be very beneficial.

I am happy to announce that Bonnie Young has been named the Volunteer CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) Coordinator for Riverdale City. Bonnie brings with her a great deal of experience and expertise. We are happy to welcome her to this new position. These CERT volunteers are so valuable to our City in times of emergency. They were very helpful filling sandbags last year as we dealt with spring flooding. Let's make it a goal during the month of March to get a little more prepared. Being prepared will allow us to take care of ourselves as well as help our neighbors until emergency services are available.

## SPRING CLEANUP SCHEDULED FOR APRIL

#### **OPEN BURN SEASON**

The State of Utah and Riverdale Fire Department allows for residential open burning of leaves, small branches, grass clippings, and other vegetation. The open burn season is from



March 30<sup>th</sup> - May 30<sup>th</sup> and September 15<sup>th</sup> - October 30<sup>th</sup>. Homeowners wishing to burn must complete an open burn permit application found on the Riverdale City web page, www.riverdalecity.com/open-burn and follow the rules below:

- 1. Obtain a burn permit from the Riverdale City Web page, riverdalecity.com/open-burn.
- Verify it is a "Green" burn day by checking the air quality forecast.
- 3. Check the weather and if wind is in the forecast, do not proceed.
- Put in any needed fuel breaks and have a plan if your fire gets out of control.
- 5. Debris should be out in the open and not near structures or under trees that may catch fire.
- 6. Have a water supply available.
- 7. Tend the fire at all times (failure to do so is a Class B Misdemeanor).
- 8. Notify your local fire department dispatch (failure to do so is a Class B Misdemeanor).
- You are liable for the costs if your fire escapes control.
- 10.Fires must be out cold before leaving the scene (failure to do so is a Class B Misdemeanor).
